MATCH PROGRAM

DATE

LOCATION

Fort Benning, Columbus, Georgia

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for participation in the NRA Intercollegiate Rifle Club Championship a shooter must be a regularly enrolled undergraduate student who complies with the eligibility rules of his or her institution. An undergraduate is a student who has not received his or her bachelor's degree. Qualifying teams and individuals will be selected based on scores fired in the 2012 NRA Intercollegiate Rifle Sectionals. See 2010 NRA International Rifle Rules 2.8 & 2.11.

INVITATIONS

The top ten ranking teams and the top thirty ranking individuals in each event in the 2012 NRA Intercollegiate Rifle Sectionals are invited to compete in the 2012 NRA Intercollegiate Rifle Club Championship. Only one team per institution per event may qualify to compete. Once the top 10 institutions are selected the same team members who fired in the sectional do not have to compete on the team in the Championships. Any shooter from that school, who fired in an Intercollegiate Rifle Sectional, may fire as a team member at the Championship. Team alternates must be listed by 7pm Tuesday March 13, prior to competition, (Rule 12.4). Only those shooters who are invited as the top 30 individuals in each event may compete for individual title and only in the event for which they were selected. If selected teams or individuals are unable to attend, invitations will be passed down until all slots are filled.

Teams qualifying in one of the two team events may participate in both team events in order to compete for national aggregate championship awards only.

ENTRY FEES

Individual competition per event - \$32.00

Team competition per event - \$52.00

Each competitor firing in the individual matches will pay an entry fee of \$30.00 per match event to the NRA. Each team will pay \$50.00 per match event to the NRA. Payment is due upon registration at the Championships. Make checks payable to the National Rifle Association.

The top three qualifying teams and the top five qualifying individuals from the overall results in the 2012 Intercollegiate Rifle Sectionals will be awarded free entry to the NRA Intercollegiate Rifle Club Championships. These awards will be made in both the Smallbore Rifle and the Air Rifle Championships.

REGISTRATION

Registration for all teams and individuals attending the Championship will be Tuesday, March 13 from 9:00 am - 4:00 pm at the range. If late registration is required an appointment must be scheduled.

RANGE WAIVERS

NRA range waivers as well as USAMU range waivers must be completed by each competitor prior to firing.

RULES

The most current NRA INTERNATIONAL RIFLE RULES will govern the 2012 NRA Intercollegiate Rifle Club Championships.

COURSE OF FIRE

Smallbore Rifle: refer to Rule 7.2.

Air Rifle: refer to Rule 7.4

TIES

Ties will be broken in accordance to the NRA Rule Book, Section 15.

COACHING

Coaching is not permitted while a competitor is on the firing line (Rule 9.10).

SCORING

Team Captains will be given the opportunity immediately following the match to challenge their teams' scores. A Jury will handle all challenges on the firing line. Electronic targets will be used in all events. Spotting scopes are not necessary as a monitor is set up at each firing point to display shot location.

CHALLENGES

All administrative questions or challenges on scores should be directed to the Statistical Officer. Challenge time expires one hour after all scores for each relay are posted. Only Administrative Challenges will be accepted regarding posted scores.

PROTEST/APPEAL

A Jury Chairman and Jury will be appointed in accordance with NRA rules. The decision of the Protest/Appeal Jury is final.
